THE RADIO ALSO QUOTED THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS AS STATING THAT SHIPPING ON THE DANUBE REMAINED UNDISTURBED, AND THERE IS NO RPT NO CHANGE IN THE TRAFFIC OF THE BUDAPEST - FERIHEGY AIRPORT.

THE RADIO TONIGHT ALSO QUOTED THE CABINET AS SAYING AT ITS YESTERDAY MEETING THAT "A GENERAL IMPROVEMENT CAN BE OBSERVED IN POSTAL AND TELECOMMUNICATION SERVICES BETWEEN HUNGARY AND CZECHOSLOVAKIA."

THE COUNCIL STATED THAT TEMPORARY TRAFFIC RESTRICTIONS HAVE AFFECTED HUNGARIAN-CZECHOSLOVAK EXPORT IMPORT TRANSPORTS AS WELL AS TRANSIT TRAFFIC.

MEASURES HAVE BEEN TAKEN THAT FOREIGN TOURISTS SHOULD SPEND THEIR HOLIDAYS UNDISTURBED IN HUNGARY, THE CABINET SAID.

THE RADIO THEN QUOTED THE COUNCIL AS SAYING "SUPPLY HAS BEEN UNDISTURBED IN THE WHOLE COUNTRY IN SPITE OF THE FACT THAT IN BUDAPEST AND OTHER TOWNS AND VILLAGES PEOPLE BOUGHT IN RECENT DAYS MUCH MORE FLOUR, SUGAR, LARD, RICE AND ESPECIALLY SALT THAN USUAL BUT THIS COMPLETELY GROUNDLESS HOARDING IS ABOUT TO CEASE."
