

COPENHAGEN, AUG 31 (RFE SPECIAL/THOMSON)- LAND OG FOLK, THE DANISH CP DAILY, COVERED THE CSSR STORY TODAY.

ON THE FRONT PAGE WITH 200 WORDS OF A THREE-COLUMN STORY, HEADLINED "THE LEADERS IN PRAGUE ARE ENERGETICALLY WORKING FOR A NORMALIZATION". THE STORY CONTINUED WITH 450 WORDS ON THE BACK PAGE AND CONTAINED AMONG OTHER THINGS, AN APPEAL BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK TUC, POLICHECK, TO THE WORKERS TO RESUME THEIR WORK. AMONG THE SOURCES FROM AGENCIES LAND OG FOLKS MOSCOW CORRESPONDENT.

ALSO ON THE FRONT PAGE WAS ANOTHER THREE-COLUMN, 500 WORD, RE-WRITE BY LOFS VIENNA CORRESPONDENT, ERLEY OLSEN, GIVING A STORY BY AUSTRIAN COMMUNIST PARTYS PRAGUE CORRESPONDENT, WITH THE HEADLINE "SUPPORT TO THE GOVERNMENT BUT OCCUPATION IS REJECTED".

PAGE THREE CARRIED A ONE-COLUMN, 100 WORD, STORY ABOUT THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE DANISH BOOKBINDING AND CARTON WORKERS UNION, PASSING A STATEMENT IN WHICH THEY DEPLORE THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA. A ONE-COLUMN STORY, 150 WORDS, ABOUT A BURMEISTER AND WAINES SHIPYARDS DELEGATION CURRENTLY VISITING THE USSR. THIS STORY WAS DATED APN MOSCOW, AND CONTAINED AN INTERVIEW WITH BENT FJELLERAD OF THE DELEGATION, AND HE EXPLAINED THAT THE DELEGATION HAD BEEN VERY WELL RECEIVED. "THE RUSSIANS WERE VERY HOSPITABLE".

PAGE 7 HAD A TWO-COLUMN STORY, 300 WORDS, FROM LOF VIENNA ON AN EDITORIAL IN THE AUSTRIAN CP ORGAN, OESTERREICHISCHE FOLKSTIMME ON THE SITUATION IN CSSR, SAYING THAT IT IS NOW NECESSARY AMONG OTHER THINGS TO UNDERSTAND THE WORD NORMALIZATION. THE STORY ALSO CONTAINED A STATEMENT BY PARTY CHAIRMAN FRANZ MUHRI WHO RE-ITERATES HIS SUPPORT OF THE CZECH COMMUNISTS.

AT THE BOTTOM OF PAGE 7, LAND OG FOLK CARRIED A 50-WORD STORY ABOUT THE DANISH SHAREHOLDER ORGANIZATION HAVING TOLD THE BULGARIAN AGRICULTURAL PARTY THAT BECAUSE OF DEVELOPMENT IN THE CSSR A VISIT TO DENMARK, PLANNED FOR NEXT MONTH BY THE BULGARIANS, HAS BEEN CANCELLED.

THE BACK PAGE (10) HAD A 50-WORD STORY SAYING THAT THE INTERNATIONAL FAIR IN BRNO, TO HAVE BEEN OPENED ON SEPT. 8, HAS BEEN POSTPONED.
