CS - CP CENTRAL COMMITTEE UNDER REVIEW IN PRAGUE (1830 ROUNDUP)

MUNICH, AUG 31 (CNR)- THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY'S CENTRAL COMMITTEE IS MEETING IN PRAGUE TODAY TO DISCUSS THE COMMITTEE'S COMPOSITION.

RADIO BUDAPEST SAID IN A REPORT ON THE MEETING THAT IT WOULD PROBABLY CONTINUE TOMORROW.

A RADIO DANUBE BROADCAST ON THE SESSION SAID SLOVAKIA'S REPRESENTATION ON THE COMMITTEE WOULD ALSO BE DISCUSSED, AND THE RESULTS OF THE RECENT SLOVAK PARTY'S EXTRA-ORDINARY CONGRESS TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION.

IN BRATISLAVA, MEANWHILE, SLOVAK OFFICIALS AND THE SOVIET TROOP COMMANDER TODAY DISCUSSED THE WITHDRAWAL OF FOREIGN TROOPS FROM THE CITY.

THE COMMANDER, SAID A RADIO DANUBE REPORT, TOLD THE SLOVAKS HE WOULD PULL OUT OF THE CITY "WHEN THE CZECHOSLOVAK STATE ORGANS ASSUME THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR PUBLIC ORDER AND THE NORMAL RUNNING OF LIFE."

SLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY PRESIDUM MEMBER ANTON TAZKY SAID IN A NEWSPAPER ARTICLE TODAY THAT CZECHOSLOVAKIA WOULD "CONTINUE TO MARCH ON THE ROAD OF JANUARY 1968."

TAZKY SAID IN THE SLOVAK YOUTH UNION DAILY SMENA THAT IT WOULD, HOWEVER, TAKE MUCH TIME "BEFORE WE REACH JANUARY."

PRAGUE IS NOW A SAD AND BRAVE CITY, SAID RADIO CZECHOSLOVAKIA TODAY.

"SAD", THE RADIO SAID, "BECAUSE THE PEOPLE ARE NOT RPT NOT TALKING LOUDLY WITH EACHOTHER AND HARDLY ANYONE IS SMILING IN THE STREETS, AND BRAVE BECAUSE IT HAS MANAGED TO UNDERSTAND THE SITUATION."
