

MOSCOW, SEPT. 1, REUTER - CZECHOSLOVAK "COUNTER-REVOLUTIONARIES" OPENED FIRE ON SOVIET TROOPS IN THE SLOVAK CAPITAL OF BRATISLAVA IN THREE SEPARATE INCIDENTS ON FRIDAY, THE SOVIET COMMUNIST PARTY NEWSPAPER PRAVDA REPORTED TODAY.

IN A REPORT FROM ITS CORRESPONDENT THERE, THE NEWSPAPER SAID THAT IN THE FIRST INCIDENT SEVEN SHOTS WERE FIRED AT SOVIET SOLDIERS FROM A MOVING CAR.

TWO HOURS LATER A COLUMN OF SOVIET TROOPS CAME UNDER FIRE AS THEY MOVED THROUGH ONE OF THE CITY'S STREETS.

IN THE EVENING A GROUP OF OFFICERS LAYING WREATHS AT THE CITY'S MEMORIAL TO SOVIET TROOPS WHO DIED THERE IN THE SECOND WORLD WAR ALSO CAME UNDER FIRE, IT SAID. IT GAVE NO DETAILS OF ANY CASUALTIES OR SOVIET COUNTER-ACTION.

PRAVDA SAID REACTIONARY FORCES WERE DISRUPTING THE ECONOMIC LIFE OF BRATISLAVA IN THEIR EFFORTS TO PROVOKE DISCONTENT AMONG THE POPULATION.

PRAVDA CLAIMED THAT CZECHOSLOVAKS WHO WANTED TO BE FRIENDLY WITH SOVIET TROOPS WERE BEING PUNISHED BY COUNTER-REVOLUTIONARIES.

ONE OLD WOMAN WHO OFFERED THE USE OF HER WELL TO SOVIET TROOPS WAS PUBLICLY THREATENED WITH HANGING WHEN THE SOVIET TROOPS LEFT, IT SAID.

A GIRL'S HEAD WAS SHAVED IN PUBLIC BECAUSE SHE TALKED TO THE RUSSIANS, IT ADDED.

THE NEWSPAPER, IN ITS REPORT FROM TWO CORRESPONDENTS IN BRATISLAVA, SAID THAT MANY FACTORIES IN SLOVAKIA WERE RUNNING OUT OF RAW MATERIALS BECAUSE DELIVERIES FROM BOHEMIA AND MORAVIA WERE BEING DELIBERATELY DELAYED.
