X/4 CS - RADIO DANUBE QUESTIONS SOVIET SINCERITY

MUNICH, SEPT 1 (CMD) - RADIO DANUBE ASKED TODAY IF CZECHOSLOVAKIA'S CONCESSIONS IN MOSCOW AND ITS OBSERVANCE OF THE TERMS OF THE SOVIET-CZECHOSLOVAK AGREEMENT WERE ONE-SIDED.

THE RADIO SAID THE "PERSONNEL CHANGES BEING PREPARED IN PRAGUE DO NOT RPT NOT CONTRIBUTE TOWARD SATISFYING THE PUBLIC. RATHER THEY SERVE THE CONTRARY."

IT WAS ALSO UNPLEASANT THAT THE PERSONAL FREEDOM OF "OUR CITIZENS AN EXTREMELY DOMESTIC MATTER - DEPENDS ON UNKNOWN CIVILIAN PERSONS OF FOREIGN NATIONALITY AND NOT RPT NOT ON THE VALID LAWS OF THE REPUBLIC," THE RADIO SAID.

THE RADIO ASKED WHO WOULD REALLY DIRECT THE CZECHOSLOVAK ECONOMY, CULTURE, SCIENCE, INFORMATION AND POLICE.

THE RADIO ALSO ASKED WHETHER THE "SINCERE EFFORTS OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA AIMED AT SATISFYING THE CONDITIONS OF THE MOSCOW AGREEMENT" WOULD BE ACCOMPANIED BY EQUALLY SINCERE OBSERVANCE BY THE OTHER SIDE OF ANOTHER PARAGRAPH OF THE MOSCOW AGREEMENT CONCERNING NON-INTERFERENCE INTO CZECHOSLOVAK DOMESTIC MATTERS.
