X/4 CS - TWENTY-FIVE KILLED IN OCCUPIED PRAGUE, SAYS PRACE

MUNICH, SEPT 1 (CMD)- TWENTY FIVE CIVILIANS HAVE BEEN KILLED IN PRAGUE SINCE THE OCCUPATION FORCES MOVED IN, SAID THE CZECH TRADE UNION PAPER PRACE TODAY.

OF THE 431 PEOPLE WOUNDED, 124 WERE STILL IN HOSPITAL, SAID THE PRACE REPORT, WHICH WAS BROADCAST IN A REVIEW OF THE PRAGUE PRESS BY RADIO CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

PRACE REMINDED ITS READERS THAT INJURED PEOPLE AND THE SURVIVORS OF THOSE KILLED WERE ENTITLED TO FULL OR PARTIAL PENSION.

THIRTY-NINE FAMILIES WHOSE HOMES HAD BEEN BURNED OR DEMOLISHED HAD BEEN GIVEN TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION, THE REPORT SAID.

IN ITS REVIEW, RADIO CZECHOSLOVAKIA SAID PRAGUE PAPERS APPEARED ON THE STREETS TODAY "IN A MUCH ABRIDGED FORM."

THIS WAS BECAUSE THEY WERE STILL BEING EDITED AND PRINTED IN MAKESHIFT PREMISES. RADIO PRAGUE WAS ALSO BROADCASTING UNDER IMPROVISED CONDITIONS.

ALL PAPERS CARRIED FRONT PAGE REPORTS THAT PARTY LEADER ALEXANDER DUBCEK WAS IN GOOD HEALTH - DESPITE REPORTS "THAT HE WAS SUFFERING FROM PHYSICAL OR NERVOUS INDISPOSITION RESULTING FROM HIS INTERNMENT AND SUBSEQUENT ARDUOUS NEGOTIATIONS IN MOSCOW."
