X/4 C/S - SOVIET SOLDIERS INDIGNANT ABOUT THEIR ROLE

MUNICH, SEPT 2 (CMD)- SOVIET SOLDIERS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA ARE DISAPPOINTED AND BECOMING INDIGNANT ABOUT THEIR ROLE, A BRATISLAVA RADIO REPORTER SAYS.

THE REPORTER -- ON A TOUR OF THE CITY -- INTERVIEWED SOVIET SOLDIERS ON PATROL.

"THEY ARE DISILLUSIONED," HE SAID ON RADIO BRATISLAVA THIS MORNING, "BECAUSE THEY CAME TO DEFEND THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF SOCIALISM AGAINST COUNTERREVOLUTIONARIES, BUT ONLY FOUND NATIONS UNITED AS NEVER BEFORE AND DETERMINED TO CONTINUE BUILDING SOCIALISM.

"THE DISAPPOINTMENT OF THESE BOYS IS CHANGING INTO INDIGNATION THAT THEY WILL TAKE WITH THEM TO THE SOVIET UNION AND MAY TURN THEM INTO WHAT THEY CAME TO LOOK FOR HERE, INTO COUNTER-REVOLUTIONARIES.

"ONE OF THE SOLDIERS ON PATROL EVEN EXPRESSED THE FEAR THAT HE MIGHT NOT RPT NOT BE ALLOWED TO RETURN HOME AT ALL AND THAT SOME DISTANT PLACE IN THE SOVIET UNION MIGHT BECOME HIS NEW HOME, LEST HE (INFORMED) HIS FRIENDS AND RELATIVES . . . (INAUDIBLE)," THE BROADCAST SAID.
