

X/4 CS -- HAMOUZ APPEALS TO POPULATION

MUNICH, SEPT 2 -- (CMD) -- CZECHOSLOVAK DEPUTY PREMIER FRANTISEK HAMOUZ SAID TODAY MUCH HAS TO BE DONE BY CZECHOSLOVAKS TO BRING ABOUT A NORMALIZATION OF LIFE IN THE COUNTRY AND WITH IT THE DEPARTURE OF FOREIGN TROOPS.

HAMOUZ ALSO SAID THAT THE TROOPS HAD WITHDRAWN FROM A NUMBER OF PLACES IN THE COUNTRY AND WERE NOW TEMPORARILY IN SITES AGREED IN ADVANCE.

HAMOUZ MADE THE STATEMENT IN A SPEECH CARRIED BY RADIO CENTRAL BOHEMIA.

THE DEPUTY PREMIER SAID:

"... AFTER THE DIFFICULT DAYS WHICH OUR HOMELAND WENT THROUGH AND WHICH EACH OF US LIVED THROUGH TOO, AFTER THESE DAYS WE ARE AGAIN CONVINCED THAT THERE ARE POSSIBILITIES AND THAT A SITUATION IS EMERGING WHEN WE CAN REALLY DELIBERATE ABOUT A NORMALIZATION OF OUR LIFE.

"WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY OF GOOD MANAGERS WE LOOK AROUND OUR COUNTRY. WE ASSESS DAMAGE CAUSED, AND WE DELIBERATE ABOUT OUR FUTURE WORK.

"IT IS IMPORTANT FOR ALL OF US THAT THE LIFE OF EACH OF US, THE LIFE OF EACH COMMUNITY, OF EACH CITY AND OF OUR WHOLE REPUBLIC RETURN TO NORMAL TRACKS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, THAT TROOPS OF FIVE ARMIES OF WARSAW TREATY STATES DEPART FROM THE TERRITORY OF OUR REPUBLIC.

"IT IS UNDERSTANDABLE THAT WE HAVE TO DO MUCH TOWARD THIS; WITH CONSIDERATION, WITH REASON SOLVE WHAT IS NECESSARY. AND THIS WILL NOT RPT NOT BE EASY. (MORE)
