

X/4 CS - CZECHOSLOVAK INTERNAL BROADCASTS ON SERIOUS NOTE

MUNICH, SEPT 2 (CMD)- DOMESTIC BROADCASTS BY CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO STATIONS LAST NIGHT AND TODAY FEATURED CLASSICAL MUSIC AND LITERARY PROGRAMS EMPHASIZING PATRIOTIC THEMES.

NEWS PROGRAMS BROADCAST BY CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO STATIONS DO NOT RPT NOT CONTAIN AS MANY REPORTS AS FEATURED BEFORE AUGUST 21. NEWS REPORTAGE IS SHORT AND SOME REPORTS ARE REPEATED IN VARIOUS NEWS BROADCASTS.

THE FIRST REPORT OF A FOREIGN CORRESPONDENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO SINCE THE OCCUPATION OF THE CSSR BEGAN WAS BROADCAST BY PRAGUE RADIO AT 1618 TODAY. IT CAME FROM MOSCOW.

RADIO BRATISLAVA BEGAN TO BROADCAST ON ITS PRE-INVASION FREQUENCY AT 1700 MT TODAY..

LITERARY PROGRAMS FEATURE MOSTLY PATRIOTIC THEMES SUCH AS STORIES AND POEMS ABOUT THE HUSSITES, THE CRUSADES AGAINST CZECH "HERETICS" IN THE 15TH CENTURY AND ABOUT TIMES IN WHICH THE COUNTRY WAS NOT RPT NOT FREE.

ONE POEM WRITTEN AT THE END OF THE 19TH CENTURY CONTAINS A LINE SAYING THE CZECHS HAD LIVED AND WILL ALWAYS LIVE.

A NEW ONE-HOUR DAILY PROGRAM FOR YOUNG PEOPLE INTRODUCED AT 1500 MT TODAY OVER THE CZECHOSLOVAKIA ONE RADIO STATION INCLUDED A RECORDED READING FROM KAREL HASEK'S BOOK "GOOD SOLDIER SVEJK" BY JAN WERICH, A PRE-WAR CABARET ARTIST.

RADIO BRATISLAVA FEATURED A STORY ABOUT THE LEGENDARY SLOVAK HERO JANOSIK, WHO TOOK FROM THE RICH AND GAVE TO THE POOR, AND FOUGHT FOR HIS FREEDOM.
