

X/4 C/S -- MOSCOW SHARPLY ATTACKS PEKING ON CS

MUNICH, SEP 3 (CMD)-- RADIO MOSCOW TODAY CRITICIZED THE CHINESE ATTITUDE TOWARD THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA, AND COMPARED THE PEKING LEADERS WITH THE "MOST DISGUSTING REPRESENTATIVES OF IMPERIALIST REACTION."

COMMENTATOR BORIS KUZNETSOV CONDEMNED THE PEKING LEADERS WHO HAD SHARPLY CRITICIZED THE RESULTS OF THE SOVIET-CZECHOSLOVAK TALKS IN MOSCOW.

HE SAID PEKING WAS SO UPSET BECAUSE THE CHINESE LEADERS HAD HOPED FOR DIFFERENT OUTCOME IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA. THE CHINESE LEADERS WERE PARTICULARLY ANGRY, BECAUSE NO RPT NO BLOOD WAS SHED IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, HE SAID.

"ACCORDING TO THE IDEAS OF THE BAND OF POLITICAL ADVENTURISTS IN PEKING, THE EVENTS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA SHOULD HAVE PRODUCED ONE OF THE SHARPEST CONFLICTS AMONG THE SOCIALIST COUNTRIES," KUZNETSOV SAID.

HE ASKED ABOUT THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE "SOCALLED REVOLUTIONARIES IN PEKING AND THE MOST DISGUSTING REPRESENTATIVES OF IMPERIALIST REACTION AND OF CZECHOSLOVAK COUNTER-REVOLUTION WHO WORKED ACCORDING TO THE SAME PRESCRIPTIONS."

KUZNETSOV DECLARED THE ANSWER WAS CLEAR.

HE SAID THE WHOLE POSITION OF PEKING WAS A LOGICAL RESULT OF CHINA'S DEPARTURE FROM MARXISM-LENINISM, FROM ITS BETRAYAL OF THE CAUSE OF SOCIALISM.
