X/4 C/S -- NON-INTERFERENCE BY SOVIETS DEMANDED

MUNICH, SEP 3 (CMD)-- THE COMMUNIST PARTY PRESIDUM AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT^{IN} GOTTWALDOV (MORAVIA) HAVE CALLED FOR "NON-INTERFERENCE OF FOREIGN ARMIES INTO DOMESTIC MATTERS."

ACCORDING TO RADIO BRNO TODAY, THE PARTY DISTRICT PRESIDUM AND THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT NATIONAL COMMITTEE APPEALED TO THE COMMAND OF THE SOVIET TROOPS TO PRESERVE "THE PRINCIPLES OF THE MOSCOW COMMUNIQUE ESPECIALLY THAT THE FOREIGN ARMIES DO NOT RPT NOT INTERFERE INTO THE DOMESTIC AFFAIRS OF THE DISTRICTS AND OF GOTTWALDOV AND THAT THE SOVIET TROOPS WITHDRAW FROM THE VICINITY OF GOTTWALDOV."

THE RADIO ALSO TODAY DENIED WHAT IT TERMED RUMORS ON HEAVY LOSSES CAUSED BY MILITARY TRANSPORT VEHICLES ON THE GRAND PRIX CIRCUIT NEAR BRNO.

HEAVY DAMAGE WAS INFLICTED ONLY TO THE SURFACE OF THE CIRCUIT NEAR THE START AND ITS END, THE RADIO SAID.

IT ALSO REPORTED THAT THE SOUTH MORAVIAN THEATERS HAVE DECIDED THAT IN PROTEST AGAINST THE OCCUPATION IT WAS DECIDED TO POSTPONE THE OPENING OF THE FALL THEATER SEASON.
