X/4/9 C/S - NOT EVERYTHING NORMAL IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, SAYS WARSAW

MUNICH, SEPT 3 (CMD) - RADIO WARSAW SAID TODAY THAT CERTAIN SIGNS OF NORMALIZATION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA DID NOT RPT NOT MEAN THAT LIFE THERE WAS PURSUING A NORMAL COURSE.

THE RADIO SAID THAT AFTER 12 DAYS OF INTERRUPTION, RUDE PRAVO, THE CZECHOSLOVAK PARTY PAPER, APPEARED TODAY AGAIN IN PRAGUE.

THE RADIO SAID THAT AN AFP CORRESPONDENT SAW IN THIS ACT "YET ANOTHER EXAMPLE OF THE NORMALIZATION OF LIFE IN THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIALIST REPUBLIC."

THE RADIO SAID THAT OTHER SIGNS OF FURTHER NORMALIZATION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA WERE THE NORMAL BEGINNING OF THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR, AND NUMEROUS DECLARATIONS OF CREWS OF INDUSTRIAL FACTORIES BY MEANS OF WHICH PRODUCTION BACKLOGS ARISEN IN CONNECTION WITH RECENT EVENTS ARE BEING MADE GOOD.

"HOWEVER," SAID THE RADIO, "ALL THESE SIGNS DO NOT SHOW THAT LIFE IN THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIALIST REPUBLIC IS PURSUING A NORMAL COURSE. SLOGANS AND POSTERS SLANDERING THE SOVIET UNION AND THE ALLIED COUNTRIES CONTINUE TO APPEAR ON THE WALLS. DIVERSIONARY PROGRAMS ARE ALSO BROADCAST BY PRAGUE RADIO MAINLY FROM THE TERRITORY OF THE GERMAN FEDERAL REPUBLIC," SAID THE RADIO.
