

CS - KOMUNIST ARTICLES CRITICIZE INVASION

MUNICH, SEPT 3 (CNR) - AN ARTICLE IN KOMUNIST, THE YUGOSLAV CENTRAL COMMITTEE'S THEORETICAL WEEKLY, CHARGES THAT THE OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA WAS A CRIME COMMITTED BY LEADERS WHO WOULD IMITATE STALIN.

THE ARTICLE, BY MACEDONIAN WRITER KOLE CASULE, SAID THESE LEADERS "WOULD LIKE TO COMPEL THE WORLD NOT RPT NOT ONLY TO BE HORRIFIED BY THEIR STRENGTH BUT ALSO TO BOW BEFORE THE ALTAR OF THEIR RELIGION.

"IT SEEMS THAT THEY FEEL MOST AT EASE WHILE WEARING THE VESTMENTS OF SUPREME PRIESTS. THEY WOULD LIKE TO MAKE OF COMMUNISM A RELIGION, AND OF COMMUNISTS SAD AND STERILE BELIEVERS, PEOPLE WITHOUT INTELLECT, WITHOUT HEART AND WITHOUT DESIRE TO RESIST."

HIS WAS ONE OF SEVERAL ARTICLES IN THE AUGUST 29 ISSUE OF KOMUNIST ATTACKING THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA BY THE SOVIET UNION AND ITS FOUR WARSAW PACT ALLIES, EAST GERMANY, POLAND, HUNGARY AND BULGARIA.

CASULE WROTE THAT "THE RULERS IN MOSCOW SHOWED THEIR "IMITATIVE ATTITUDE" TOWARD STALIN BY INVADING CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

HOWEVER, CASULE WROTE, THESE LEADERS HAD NEITHER STALIN'S INTELLECT NOR HIS STRENGTH AND THEY NO LONGER LIVE IN A STALINIST ERA.

"HERE LIES THE GREATEST PROOF OF THE TEMPORARY NATURE OF THEIR ACTION AND OF THEIR FEEBLENESS," CASULE WROTE.

THEN HE DECLARED: "I BELIEVE IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, I BELIEVE IN THE REVOLUTION, I BELIEVE IN COMMUNISM.
