X/4 C/S -- NO RPT NO FREE CROSSING OF BORDERS, RADIO SAYS

MUNICH, SEPT 3 -- (CMD) -- A CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO STATION SAID TONIGHT THAT RUMORS ABOUT AN UNRESTRICTED CROSSING OF CZECHOSLOVAK BORDERS IN SOUTHERN MORAVIA ARE NOT RPT NOT TRUE.

RADIO BRNO SAID (TEXT) "THE REGIONAL ADMINISTRATION OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY CORPS (SNB) IN BRNO DRAWS THE ATTENTION OF THE CITIZENS TO THE FACT THAT RUMORS ABOUT THE UNRESTRICTED CROSSING OF OUR FRONTIERS IN SOUTH MORAVIA RE NOT RPT NOT BASED ON TRUTH.

"LEGAL EXIT FROM THE REPUBLIC IS POSSIBLE ONLY ON THE BASIS OF PROPERLY ISSUED TRAVEL DOCUMENTS." (END TEXT)

RADIO PRAGUE TONIGHT ALSO SAID THAT CZECHOSLOVAK AIRPORTS ARE STILL NOT RPT NOT "ACCEPTING" PLANES.

THROUGH THE INTERRUPTION OF TRAFFIC, CZECHOSLOVAK AIR LINES ARE LOSING 2.5 MILLION CROWNS DAILY, THE RADIO ADDED.

THE ADMINISTRATION OF TRANSPORT AIRPORTS IS CURRENTLY NEGOTIATING WITH THE COMMAND OF FOREIGN TROOPS ABOUT VACATING THE RUZYNE AIRPORT IN PRAGUE AND IN OTHER PLACES.

SINCE AUG 29 CZECHOSLOVAK AIRLINES ARE READY TO RESUME TRAFFIC.

THE PRAGUE-MOSCOW AIR LINK HAS BEEN PERMITTED TO OPERATE AS OF THURSDAY, SEPT 5, THE RADIO SAID. THE SOVIET AIRLINES WILL TAKE CARE OF THE SERVICE. CZECHOSLOVAK AIRLINES ARE EXPECTING TO RESUME

TRAFFIC ON THIS ROUTE BEGINNING WITH SEPT 9.

AS FAR AS DOMESTIC LINKS ARE CONCERNED, IT IS EXPECTED THAT THE FIRST PLANE FROM PRAGUE TO BRATISLAVA WILL TAKE OFF ON THURSDAY, SEPT 5, THE RADIO SAID.
