

SENATE DISCUSSES EFFECTS OF CSSR INTERVENTION

BERLIN, SEP 3 (RFE SPECIAL/WULFF)-- IN ITS ROUTINE MEETING TODAY THE WEST BERLIN SENATE (CITY GOVERNMENT) DECIDED TO RECOMMEND TO THE CITY'S VARIOUS DISTRICT ADMINISTRATIONS THAT THEY TAKE AN ATTITUDE OF RESERVE IN CONTACTS WITH CITIES OF COUNTRIES WHICH PARTICIPATED IN THE INTERVENTION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, A SENATE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT THAT VARIOUS CONTACTS BETWEEN WEST BERLIN DISTRICTS AND CITIES IN EASTERN EUROPE HAVE BEEN EXISTING FOR SOME TIME, SUCH AS THOSE BETWEEN THE CHARLOTTENBURG DISTRICT AND BUDAPEST.

THE SENATE ALSO DISCUSSED THE GENERAL SITUATION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA AFTER THE INTERVENTION AND POSSIBLE EFFECTS ON THE WEST, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE SAID WEST BERLIN GOVERNING MAYOR KLAUS SCHUETZ DELIVERED A REPORT ON THE SUBJECT TO THE SENATORS, BUT DID NOT RPT NOT DISCLOSE ANY FURTHER DETAILS.

AUSTRO-CZECHOSLOVAK RAILWAY TRAFFIC BACK TO NORMAL

VIENNA, SEPT 3 (RFE SPECIAL/KOSTRBA) -- PASSENGER AND FREIGHT RAILWAY TRAFFIC BETWEEN CZECHOSLOVAKIA AND AUSTRIA IS BACK TO NORMAL, INCLUDING ALL INTERNATIONAL TRAINS, THE AUSTRIAN RAILWAY ADMINISTRATION ANNOUNCED ON TUESDAY.

AIR TRAFFIC TO EASTERN EUROPE STILL RESTRICTED

VIENNA, SEPT 3 (RFE SPECIAL/KOSTRBA) -- THERE IS STILL NO AIR TRAFFIC BETWEEN VIENNA, PRAGUE AND EAST BERLIN, THE AUSTRIAN TRANSPORT MINISTRY ANNOUNCED ON TUESDAY.

FLIGHTS FROM VIENNA TO POLAND AND THE SOVIET UNION ARE BEING RE-ROUTED VIA HUNGARY.

THERE ARE NO RESTRICTIONS ON AIR TRAFFIC BETWEEN AUSTRIA, RUMANIA AND BULGARIA, THE MINISTRY SAID.

THE PROHIBITION TO USE CZECHOSLOVAK AIR SPACE INCREASED FLYING TIME BETWEEN VIENNA AND LEIPZIG FROM 70 MINUTES TO THREE HOURS. AIR TRAFFIC BETWEEN THE TWO CITIES OPERATES ON THE ROUTE VIENNA-GYOER-BUDAPEST-LVOV-CRACOW-LODZ-LEIPZIG.
