

C/S - MORNING INTRO -- SOVIET CRITICISM AND COMMENT

MOSCOW, SEPT 5 (UPI)-THE SOVIET UNION HAS PINPOINTED SOME CZECHOSLOVAK PUBLICATIONS AND A GOVERNMENT MINISTER AS OBSTACLES TO EFFORTS "TO NORMALIZE THE SITUATION."

THE TASS NEWS AGENCY TUESDAY NAMED THE FREE TELEVISION GAZETTE (SVOBODNE TELEVIZIONE GAZETA), CULTURAL LIFE (KULTURNY ZIVOT), AND YOUNG WORLD (MLADA SVET) AS PUBLICATIONS SEEKING "TO ENCOURAGE COUNTER-REVOLUTIONARY FORCES WHICH CONTINUE THEIR PROVOCATIVE PROPAGANDA AIMED AGAINST THE RESULTS OF THE SOVIET-CZECHOSLOVAK TALKS IN MOSCOW."

TASS ALSO DENIED THAT SOME CZECHOSLOVAK WRITERS HAD BEEN ARRESTED.

"THESE PEOPLE ARE EITHER SAFELY LIVING IN PRAGUE OR, APPARENTLY ON SENSING THEIR GUILT TO THE HOMELAND, HAVE RUN AWAY--SOME TO MUNICH, OTHERS TO VIENNA AND BELGRADE," IT SAID.

THE GOVERNMENT NEWSPAPER IZVESTIA ON TUESDAY NIGHT FIRED A VITRIOLIC BROADSIDE AT CZECHOSLOVAK FOREIGN MINISTER JIRI HAJEK, NOW IN SWITZERLAND.

IZVESTIA SAID HAJEK ATTEMPTED "TO TEAR CZECHOSLOVAKIA FROM THE SOCIALIST COMMUNITY," BUILD UP CLOSER RELATIONS WITH WEST GERMANY, RENEW DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WITH ISRAEL AND SOUGHT TO RE-ESTABLISH THE OLD "LITTLE ENTENTE" OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA, YUGOSLAVIA AND ROMANIA.

IT ALSO ALLEGED HAJEK HAD CHANGED HIS NAME FROM THE NAME OF KARPELES DURING WORLD WAR TWO AND HAD COLLABORATED WITH THE NAZI GESTAPO.

TASS REPORTED ON THE STEPS BEING TAKEN BY THE DUBCEK PARTY AND GOVERNMENT LEADERSHIP "ON URGENT QUESTIONS ON WHICH DEVELOPMENT OF NORMAL LIFE IN THE COUNTRY DEPENDS."
