

MUNICH, SEPT 4 (CNR)-WITH THE WARSAW PACT OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA NOW TWO WEEKS OLD, THE SITUATION IN THAT COUNTRY CONTINUES TO BE OF MAJOR WORLD INTEREST TODAY.

OCCUPYING FORCES HAVE BEEN REPORTED MOVING OUT OF MANY TOWNS AND CITIES INTO THE COUNTRYSIDE, THOUGH STILL PRESENT IN LARGE NUMBERS IN PRAGUE.

ON THE POLITICAL SIDE OF EVENTS, DEPUTY PREMIER OTA SIK, A LEADING CZECHOSLOVAK ECONOMIST, HAS RESIGNED HIS POST. HE REMAINS IN BELGRADE.

FOREIGN MINISTER JIRI HAJEK, WHO IS IN SWITZERLAND, HAS BEEN SHARPLY ATTACKED BY THE SOVIET GOVERNMENT NEWSPAPER IZVESTIA, WHILE SIK WAS CRITICISED BY RADIO WARSAW FOR HIS ECONOMIC IDEAS.

THE PRESIDUM OF THE CZECH NATIONAL COUNCIL IS TO MEET TODAY TO DISCUSS THE PREPARATION OF THE FEDERATIVE ARRANGEMENT OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

RESCUE AND RELIEF EFFORTS CONTINUE TODAY IN IRAN, WHERE TWO EARTHQUAKES OVER THE WEEKEND LEFT MANY THOUSANDS DEAD AND INJURED AND WHERE NO WORD IS YET AVAILABLE ON THE EFFECTS OF THE TREMORS IN SOME REMOTE AREAS.

FURTHER NEWS IS AWAITED ON ANOTHER EARTHQUAKE WHICH SHOOK CENTRAL AND WESTERN TURKEY YESTERDAY. FIRST OFFICIAL REPORTS INDICATED 14 PERSONS KILLED AND 150 INJURED IN THE TURKISH QUAKE.

U.S. AND NORTH VIETNAMESE NEGOTIATORS ARE TO MEET IN PARIS THIS MORNING FOR ANOTHER WEEKLY SESSION OF THE PRELIMINARY PEACE TALKS IN PROGRESS SINCE MID-DAY.

PRESIDENT JOHNSON IS DUE BACK IN WASHINGTON TODAY AFTER TEN DAYS SPENT AT HIS TEXAS RANCH, AND HAS SUMMONED THE NATIONAL SECURITY COUNCIL TO MEET WITH HIM THIS EVENING. THERE HAS BEEN NO ADVANCE WORD ON THE REASON FOR THE MEETING OF THE HIGHEST AMERICAN POLICY-MAKING AND ADVISORY GROUP.

THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL IS TO MEET THIS EVENING TO CONSIDER AN ISRAELI CHARGE THAT EGYPT COMMITTED A DELIBERATE ACT OF AGGRESSION IN THE AMBUSH OF AN ISRAELI PATROL ON THE ISRAELI-HELD EAST BANK OF THE SUEZ CANAL AUGUST 26.

THE FOREIGN MINISTERS OF THE FIVE NORDIC STATES TODAY ARE TO CONCLUDE THEIR STOCKHOLM MEETING AND ISSUE A COMMUNIQUE ON THE TWO-DAY SESSION, AT WHICH THE FOREIGN MINISTERS OF SWEDEN, NORWAY, DENMARK, FINLAND AND ICELAND DISCUSSED EUROPEAN AND GLOBAL AS WELL AS NORDIC DEVELOPMENTS.

THE "GERMAN CATHOLIC DAYS," A MEETING OF SOME 20,000 PARTICIPANTS FROM AROUND THE WORLD, INCLUDING 40 BISHOPS, OPENS TODAY IN ESSEN, WEST GERMANY, AND IS TO CONTINUE THROUGH SUNDAY WITH STUDY OF PROBLEMS OF THE CHURCH IN MODERN SOCIETY.

IN WOLFACH, WEST GERMANY, ADVOCATES OF WORLD COMMUNISM TODAY CONTINUE THEIR TEN-DAY CONVENTION.

ON THE LIGHTER SIDE, FRENCH THEATERS ARE SLOWLY COMING BACK TO WORK AGAIN AND THE COMEDIE FRANCAISE IS OPENING THE WINTER SEASON TODAY WITH "THE IMAGINARY SICK" BY MOLIERE.

MEDIAEVAL MUSIC IN A FABLED ON LAKE GENEVA WILL BE THE FEATURE OF THE MONTREUX 1968 FESTIVAL TODAY. THE "MADRIGALISTES DE VENISE" WILL PRESENT A PROGRAM OF GABRIELI AND MONTEVERDI IN THE MASSIVE, STONE CASTLE OF CHILLON JUTTING OUT INTO THE LAKE NEAR MONTREUX. THE PROGRAM STARTS AT 2100.

UNUSUAL ART IS FEATURED IN TWO ZURICH GALLERIES: AT THE GALERIE STUMMER AND HUBSCHMID THERE IS A DISPLAY OF ACRYLIC PICTURES BY SERGIO PICCALUGA (UNTIL SEPT. 28) AND IN THE GALERIE BISHOFBERGER THERE IS AN EXHIBITION OF PSYCHEDELIC ART, GUARANTEED TO MAKE YOUR HEAD SPIN.
