X/4 C/S -- BUDAPEST: CZECHOSLOVAKS DIVIDED ON MOSCOW "AGREEMENT"

MUNICH, SEPT 4 (CMD) -- RADIO BUDAPEST TODAY QUOTED THE HUNGARIAN NEWS AGENCY MTI AS HAVING REPORTED THAT THE EXISTING CZECHOSLOVAK POLITICAL FORCES EITHER SUPPORT THE "MOSCOW AGREEMENT" OR OPPOSE IT.

"THE FACT THAT NO RPT NO CONTRARY OPINION IS SOUNDED IN PUBLIC," THE RADIO QUOTED MTI AS SAYING, "DOES NOT RPT NOT MEAN THE COMPLETE ABSENCE OF OPPOSITION."

MTI SAID "NOBODY TAKES A STAND IN PUBLIC AGAINST THE NORMALIZATION OF PUBLIC LIFE. THE ANTI-SOCIALIST FORCES CONSIDER THE TIME INOPPORTUNE FOR AN OPEN ATTACK AGAINST LEADERS WHOM THEY RECENTLY SUPPORTED IN THE INTEREST OF THEIR OWN POLITICAL GOALS."

ON THE OTHER HAND, AFTER THE WEEKEND SESSION OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE, MTI REPORTED "A NUMBER OF DISTRICT AND LOCAL PARTY ORGANIZATIONS, VARIOUS SOCIAL AND MASS ORGANISATIONS PLEDGED THEIR SUPPORT TO THE MOSCOW AGREEMENTS."
