C/S -- PRAVDA-- SOVIET TROOPS REMAIN IN CS

MOSCOW, SEPT. 4, REUTER - THE SOVIET COMMUNIST PARTY NEWSPAPER "PRAVDA" SAID TODAY THAT ANTI-SOCIALIST FORCES IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA WERE RESISTING THE PROCESS OF "NORMALISATION" AND SOVIET TROOPS HAD TO STAY THERE FOR "THE DEFENCE OF SOCIALIST ACHIEVEMENTS."

"THE PROCESS OF NORMALISATION OF ALL SPHERES OF LIFE IN THE REPUBLIC, THE STRENGTHENING OF THE POSITIONS OF SOCIALISM, ANSWERS THE BASIC INTERESTS OF THE PEOPLE OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA," THE NEWSPAPER SAID IN A REPORT FROM PRAGUE.

"MANY COMMUNISTS DO NOT SHUT THEIR EYES TO THE FACT THAT THERE ARE GREAT DIFFICULTIES ON THIS ROAD, AND THAT ANTI-SOCIALIST FORCES ARE CONTINUING TO RESIST THE PROCESS OF NORMALISATION."

IN A REPORT FROM BRATISLAVA, "PRAVDA" SAID "A PROCESS OF RECOVERY" WAS SLOWLY TAKING PLACE IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

BUT IT ADDED: "OUR SOLDIERS AS BEFORE ARE HAVING TO STAND VIGILANTLY ON GUARD OF THE SOCIALIST ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE WORKERS OF THE COUNTRY, HELPING THEM IN THIS RESPONSIBLE, HISTORIC HOUR."

"THE ARRIVAL OF ALLIED TROOPS BROUGHT TO LIGHT THE PRESENCE OF A WELL-SUPPLIED AND ORGANISED COUNTER-REVOLUTIONARY UNDERGROUND, "PRAVDA'S CORRESPONDENT IN BRATISLAVA SAID.

"THE ALLIED TROOPS ENTERED THE COUNTRY SUDDENLY. SO WHERE DID RIFLES AND MACHINE GUNS ON TOWERS AND IN ATTICS SUDDENLY APPEAR FROM?" THE NEWSPAPER ASKED.
