

PRAGUE, SEPT. 4, REUTER--CZECHOSLOVAK TELEVISION WENT ON THE AIR WITH ITS NORMAL PROGRAMME TONIGHT FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE THE INVASION TWO WEEKS AGO TO THE STRAINS OF A PATRIOTIC SONG, "MY FATHERLAND."

THE PRETTY FAIR-HAIRED ANNOUNCER COULD HARDLY SPEAK FOR EMOTION WHEN SHE SAID THE TELEVISION STAFF WANTED TO THANK EVERYBODY FOR THE CALM AND DISCIPLINE THEY HAD SHOWN AND THEIR EFFORTS TO GET ON WITH THE JOB.

(CMD) -- "WE THANK YOU FOR THE EFFORT FOR A SPEEDY NORMALIZATION OF OUR LIFE, FOR THE ATTEMPT TO CONTINUE IN NEW CONDITIONS IN THE WORK FROM WHERE WE LEFT OFF," THE ANNOUNCER SAID."

"WE, THE TELEVISION WORKERS, TOO, ARE PREPARED TO FULFIL THE APPEALS AND ADVICE OF OUR PRESIDENT LUDVIK SBOBODA.

"WE SUPPORT THE LEADERSHIP OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA HEADED BY ALEXANDER DUBCEK. WE ARE PREPARED TO FOLLOW LAWS ISSUED BY THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY HEADED BY COMRADE JOSEF SMRKOVSKY.

"WE ARE READY TO SUPPORT AND FOLLOW THE DECISIONS OF OUR GOVERNMENT WITH ITS CHAIRMAN COMRADE OLDRICH CERNIK." THE ANNOUNCER SAID.

(REUTER) -- THE TELEVISION NEWCAST SHOWED A SHOT OF PARTY LEADER ALEXANDER DUBCEK ARRIVING AT COMMUNIST PARTY HEADQUARTERS HERE TODAY AND RECEIVING A BOUQUET FROM A LITTLE GIRL.
