

C/S -- SOME PAPERS PUBLISHING - 0700 INTRO

MUNICH, SEPT 5 (CNR)-SOVIET INFANTRYMEN AND TANKS REMAINED IN AND AROUND PRAGUE CITY PARKS THIS MORNING AND SEVERAL MAJOR NEWSPAPERS REMAINED UNDER RUSSIAN OCCUPATION.

HUNDREDS OF SOVIET TANKS WERE PARKED INSIDE THE CITY LIMITS, MOST OF THEM HIDDEN IN THE FOLIAGE OF THE CITY PARKS. THE LARGEST CONCENTRATION WAS IN THE PARK ADJOINING THE PRAGUE ZOO.

PRAGUE RADIO AND CZECHOSLOVAKIAN TELEVISION WERE FREED WEDNESDAY FROM SOVIET OCCUPATION AND THE NEWSPAPERS ALLOWED TO RESUME PUBLICATION SO FAR INCLUDE RUDE PRAVO , THE COMMUNIST PARTY DAILY, THE EVENING NEWSPAPER VECERNI PRAHA AND CESKO SLOVENSKO SPORT.

RADIO PRAGUE SAID WEDNESDAY THAT THE EDITORIAL OFFICES AND PRINTING SHOPS OF THE YOUTH UNION DAILY, MLADA FRONTA, THE TRADE UNION PAPER PRACE, THE PEOPLES PARTY DAILY LIDOVA DEMOKRACIE AND THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIALIST PARTY PAPER SVOBODNE SLOVO WERE STILL OCCUPIED.

THE RADIO ADDED THAT THE EDITORIAL OFFICE AND THE PRINTING SHOP OF THE AGRICULTURAL PAPER ZEMEDEL'SKE NOVINY WERE PREPARED TO START WORK IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF "THE GOVERNMENT TALKS."

THE PRAGUE CORRESPONDENTS FOR UNITED PRESS INTERNATIONAL AND THE NEW YORK TIMES QUOTED INFORMED SOURCES AS SAYING THAT THE CZECHOSLOVAK GOVERNMENT HAD LAID DOWN RULES FOR WHAT MAY OR MAY NOT BE PUBLISHED IN THE NEWS MEDIA.

BOTH UPI AND THE TIMES CORRESPONDENT QUOTED SOURCES AS SAYING THAT AMONG THE PROHIBITIONS PLACED ON THE NEWS MEDIA WOULD BE THE USE OF THE WORD "OCCUPATION" AND "OCCUPIERS" IN REFERENCE TO THE SOVIET TROOPS IN THE COUNTRY.

THE SOURCES QUOTED SAID THAT THERE WOULD NOT RPT NOT BE ANY CENSORS INSTALLED IN THE OFFICES OF THE MASS MEDIA BUT THERE WOULD BE TWICE-WEEKLY MEETINGS WITH EDITOR TO ENFORCE NEW REGULATIONS.
