C/S -- 1ST ADD SOME PAPERS PUBLISHING (CN 38) XXX REGULATIONS

RADIO PRAGUE SAID LAST NIGHT THAT THE GOVERNMENT MEETING IN PRAGUE WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON DISCUSSED A DRAFT LAW ON MEASURES FOR STRENGTHENING CALM AND ORDER, MEASURES ON PUBLIC ASSEMBLY AND ASSOCIATION AND "THE NON-PERIODICAL PRESS."

RADIO CZECHOSLOVAKIA SAID LAST NIGHT THAT THE SLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY PRESIDUM HAD DISCUSSED THE WORK OF THE PRESS, RADIO AND TELEVISION AT A MEETING TUESDAY.

THE RADIO SAID THAT NEWSPAPERS, RADIO AND TELEVISION STATIONS HAD DECIDED TO APPOINT EDITORS WHO WOULD BE RESPONSIBLE FOR SELF-CENSORSHIP OF ALL PRINTED AND BROADCAST MATERIAL.

CZECHOSLOVAK TELEVISION WHICH WENT ON THE AIR WITH ITS NORMAL PROGRAM LAST NIGHT FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE THE INVASION, SAID THAT THE "RESPONSIBLE COMRADES" CHOSEN BY THE SLOVAK EDITORIAL OFFICES WOULD SEE TO IT THAT JOURNALISTS WROTE "IN THE SPIRIT OF THE MOSCOW AGREEMENT, THE LINE OF THE EXTRAORDINARY CONGRESS OF THE SLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY AND OF THE RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNMENT."

RADIO WARSAW SAID THAT THE CZECHOSLOVAK PRESS AGENCY CETEKA WOULD RESUME NORMAL OPERATION TODAY.

THE RADIO QUOTED PAP CORRESPONDENTS SAYING THAT ILLEGAL LEAFLETS CONTINUED TO BE PUT UP IN PRAGUE AND ELSEWHERE.
