

X/4 C/S - ZAGREB'S POLEMICS WITH PRAVDA

MUNICH, SEPT 5 (CMD) - RADIO ZAGREB SAID LAST NIGHT THAT THE SOVIET COMMUNIST PARTY NEWSPAPER, PRAVDA, HAD FAILED TO REPORT THAT THE BIGGEST WESTERN COMMUNIST PARTIES DISAGREED WITH MOSCOW ON CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

RADIO ZAGREB'S MOSCOW CORRESPONDENT, BORIS HRZIC, REFERRED TO YESTERDAY'S PRAVDA AND SAID "IT WAS FORCED TO ADMIT THAT SOME COMMUNIST PARTIES DID NOT RPT NOT AGREE WITH THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA BY THE WARSAW PACT TROOPS."

"THE WHOLE WORLD KNOWS THAT THIS DOES NOT RPT NOT ONLY CONCERN 'SOME CMRADES', BUT ALSO THE BIGGEST COMMUNIST PARTIES OF THE WEST, AND CENTRAL COMMITTEES HEADED BY GENERAL SECRETARIES (LUIGI) LONGO AND (WALDECK) ROCHET. IN THE SAME WAY THE MAJOR PARTY OF JAPAN AND MANY OTHER SIGNIFICANT PARTIES WERE OMITTED, WHILE SMALL PARTIES, SUCH AS THOSE OF WEST BERLIN AND LUXEMBOURG ARE WIDELY ADVERTISED," HRZIC ADDED.

HRZIC ALSO SAID THAT PRAVDA DIVIDED THE YUGOSLAV PARTY INTO "COMMUNISTS" AND "THE LEADERSHIP." THE LATTER IS EVEN CALLED REVISIONIST, HE SAID.

THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL YEAR IN THE SOVIET UNION HAS BEEN EXPLOITED FOR "TALK ABOUT CZECHOSLOVAKIA, AND FOR CRUEST DISTORTION O OUR VIEWS, WHEREBY PROFESSORS CALLED US ALL POSSIBLE NAMES," THE COMMENTATOR ADDED.

HRZIC SAID THAT THE NEWS ON THE CONCENTRATION OF SOVIET TROOPS ON THE BORDERS OF RUMANIA HAD BEEN DENIED, "BUT PEOPLE STILL HAVE A VIVID MEMORY OF SIMILAR DENIALS IN CONNECTION WITH CZECHOSLOVAKIA."
