X/4 C/S -- RADIOS REPORT ABOUT SITUATION

MUNICH, SEPT 5 -- (CMD) -- CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO STATIONS TODAY FEATURED REPORTS ABOUT THE NORMALIZATION OF LIFE IN VARIOUS SECTORS OF THE COUNTRY'S LIFE.

AT THE SAME TIME, HOWEVER, THE RADIOS REPORTED ABOUT LOSSES RESULTING FROM LAST MONTH'S OCCUPATION BY TROOPS OF THE USSR AND ITS FOUR ALLIES.

PRAGUE RADIO QUOTED TONIGHT (1645) A REPORT ISSUED BY THE GOVERNMENT PRESIDUM TODAY WHICH SAID THAT AS REGARDS THE SUPPLY OF FOODSTUFFS, ELECTRIC POWER AND COAL MINING THE SITUATION WAS BECOMING NORMAL.

THE REPORT SAID THAT IN THE ENGINEERING AND THE MINING INDUSTRIES REGULAR ATTENDANCE OF WORKERS WAS BEING RESTORED AND WORKING MORALE WAS GOOD.

DESPITE MUCH IMPROVEMENT, THERE IS A SHORTAGE OF COKE PARTICULARLY IN THE EAST SLOVAK IRON WORKS AND A SHORTAGE OF FOUNDRY MATERIAL IN THE SKODA WORKS.

THE REPORT SAID THE LOSS OF FOREIGN CURRENCY INCOME FROM TOURISTS FROM "CAPITALIS" STATES WAS ESTIMATED AT ABOUT 55 MILLION "FOREIGN CURRECNY" CORWNS.

IN AN EARLIER REPORT TODAY, THE RADIO SAID (1200) EMPLOYEES OF THE RAILWAY STATION IN JIHLAVA HAD SUGGESTED THAT THIS YEAR'S CELEBRATIONS OF RAILWAYMEN'S DAY BE CANCELLED AS A RESULT OF "GREAT LOSSES" THE RAILWAYS SUFFERED RECENTLY.
