

X/4 STAMBOLIC SPEAKS OF THREAT TO WORLD PEACE

BELGRADE, SEPTEMBER 5 (CMD)- THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SERBIAN LEAGUE OF COMMUNISTS, PETAR STAMBOLIC, WARNED IN BELGRADE TODAY "THAT THE SHARPENING OF THE INTERNATIONAL SITUATION PUTS PEACE IN JEOPARDY (NOT ONLY) IN THE WORLD, BUT ESPECIALLY IN EUROPE."

TANJUG ALSO QUOTED STAMBOLIC AS SAYING IN A SPEECH DELIVERED BEFORE A POLITICAL ACTIV THAT "ORGANIZED AND DELIBERATE ATTACKS ON YUGOSLAVIA AND HER INDEPENDENT FOREIGN POLICY WERE COMING FROM THOSE SOCIALIST COUNTRIES, WHICH ARE ENGAGED IN THE OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA."

TOUCHING ON THE YUGOSLAV LEAGUE OF COMMUNISTS' CENTRAL COMMITTEE RESOLUTION OF AUGUST 23, WHICH CONDEMNED THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA BY THE SOVIET UNION, BULGARIA, POLAND, HUNGARY AND EAST GERMANY, STAMBOLIC SPOKE ABOUT THE "TASKS OF ORGANIZING NATIONAL DEFENSE" AND "POINTED TO THE ROLE OF THE SERBIAN LEAGUE OF COMMUNISTS, ESPECIALLY AS REGARDS POLITICAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR AN ALL-OUT DEFENSE AGAINST POSSIBLE AGGRESSION."

IN THE COURSE OF HIS SPEECH, STAMBOLIC ALSO TOUCHED ON INTERNAL QUESTIONS, DEALING WITH ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL ISSUES.

AS FOR YUGOSLAVIA'S FOREIGN POLICY, HE SAID IT MUST BE "AIMED AT SAFEGUARDING PEACE IN THE WORLD AND PROTECTING THE SECURITY AND NATIONAL INDEPENDENCE OF SMALL PEOPLES."

ALSO MEETING IN BELGRADE, THE FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE OF PARLIAMENT VOICED ITS SUPPORT OF THE GOVERNMENT'S STAND ON THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA. (TANJUG, SEPT 5)
