OCCUPATION CAUSES CAR PRODUCTION LOSSES.

MUNICH, SEPT 6 (CMD) -- RADIO BRATISLAVA SAID TODAY THAT "THE LATEST EXTRAORDINARY EVENTS" HAD AFFECTED THE CAR PRODUCTION IN MLADA BOLES LAV, NORTH EAST OF PRAGUE.

THE PRODUCTION LOSS SO FAR AMOUNTS TO 1,575 SKODA CARS OF THE 1000MB MODEL. THAT LOSS WILL BE INCREASED BY ANOTHER 1,800 VEHICLES DUE TO SIMILAR DIFFICULTIES AT 130 SUPPLYING ENTERPRISES, THE RADIO ADDED.

THE RADIO ALSO SAID THAT THE DAILY DELIVERY OF ABOUT 400 CARS WAS PROCEEDING NORMALLY, BUT THAT HOME AND FOREIGN BUYERS WOULD HAVE TO WAIT FOR THE OVERCOMING OF THE PRODUCTION LOSS.

JAPAN TOLD BUSINESS AS USUAL

TOKYO, SEPT. 6, REUTER - CZECHOSLOVAKIA HAS INFORMED JAPANESE TRADING FIRMS THAT BUSINESS BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES CAN NOW BE RESTORED TO NORMAL, THE MITSUI COMPANY SAID TODAY.

THE NOTICE WAS CABLED FROM THE CZECHOSLOVAK MACHINE TOOL TRADING CORPORATION, "STROJ IMPORT", TO MITSUI, ITS AGENT IN JAPAN.

MITSUI WAS HOPING THAT NEGOTIATIONS FOR THE SALE OF A SYNTHETIC RESIN PLANT TO CZECHOSLOVAKIA, SUSPENDED SINCE THE CRISIS, WOULD BE RESUMED SOON.

SOVIET ARMY ENSEMBLE VISIT TO JAPAN POSTPONED

TOKYO, SEPT 6, REUTER - A PLANNED VISIT BY THE SOVIET ARMY SONG AND DANCE ENSEMBLE TO MAJOR JAPANESE CITIES LATER THIS MONTH HAS BEEN PUT OFF INDEFINITELY, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE SPONSORS SAID TODAY.

HE ADDED THE POSTPONEMENT HAD BEEN CAUSED BY PUBLIC INDIGNATION OVER THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.
