

SWEDES MAKE CS CITIZENS' ENTRY EASIER

STOCKHOLM, SEPT 6 -- (RFE SPECIAL/HENRY) -- THE SWEDISH CABINET YESTERDAY RE-AFFIRMED AN ALIENS COMMISSION DECISION OF AUG. 27 TO WAIVE NORMAL RESIDENCE PERMIT MOTIVATION REQUIREMENTS AND WORK PERMIT PROCEDURES FOR ALL CZECHOSLOVAKS WHO WISH TO STAY IN OR ENTER SWEDEN.

THE ALIENS COMMISSION DECIDED LAST MONTH THAT "NORMAL PROCEDURES WILL BE WAIVED DUE TO THE (INVASION) SITUATION". DIRECTOR INGVAR JOENSSEN SAID ALL CZECHOSLOVAKS IN SWEDEN WOULD BE GIVEN IMMEDIATE RESIDENCE AND WORK PERMITS FOR UP TO TWO MONTHS DURATION. NORMALLY, APPLICANTS MUST SUBMIT A STATEMENT OF MOTIVATION FOR THEIR DESIRE TO STAY AND TO WORK, AND PROCESSING OF THIS CAN TAKE MONTHS.

YESTERDAYS CABINET MEETING RESULTED IN A GOVERNMENT DECLARATION THAT ALL CZECHOSLOVAKS WHO WISHED TO ENTER SWEDEN COULD DO SO AND RECEIVE TEMPORARY RESIDENCE PERMITS. THEY WOULD NOT NEED TO APPLY FOR WORK PERMITS IN ADVANCE, A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN ADDED, IN VIEW OF THE ALIENS COMMISSION DECISION OF LAST MONTH TO GRANT THESE AUTOMATICALLY FOR A TEMPORARY PERIOD.

THE BUDAPEST AUTUMN FAIR OPENED TODAY

IN HIS OPENING ADDRESS, MINISTER OF INTERNAL TRADE ISTVAN SZURDI SAID "THE AUTUMN FAIR WILL ENABLE INDUSTRY AND TRADE TO CARRY OUT DIRECT AND JOINT MARKET RESEARCH AND TO ELIMINATE DISCREPANCIES BETWEEN INDUSTRY AND TRADE."

BOMB BLASTS IN BRITTANY

BREST, FRANCE, SEPT 6, REUTER -- A SERIES OF BOMB BLASTS HIT BRITTANY EARLY TODAY IN WHAT APPEARED TO BE PART OF A NEW RESURGENCE OF SABOTAGE BY BRETON NATIONALISTS.

NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED.

THE TOWN HALL AT PONT AVEN WAS BADLY DAMAGED WHEN A BOMB WENT OFF ABOUT 2.30 A.M. (0230 MT) IN A FIRST FLOOR CORRIDOR. THE TAX COLLECTION OFFICE AT ROSPORDEN WAS LESS SERIOUSLY DAMAGED BY AN EXPLOSION OUTSIDE IT ABOUT 30 MINUTES LATER.

OTHER EXPLOSIVE CHARGES FELLED THREE ELECTRICITY PYLONS, AND TELEGRAPH POLES WERE CUT DOWN IN SEVERAL PLACES DURING THE NIGHT.

THE EXPLOSIONS MADE A TOTAL OF 10 BLASTS ACROSS BRITTANY IN LESS THAN A WEEK.
