X/13 EURO -- BRANDT - DEBRE TALKS TO FOCUS ON CS DEVELOPMENTS, EEC

BONN, SEPT 6 (RFE SPECIAL/MARSH) -- TALKS BETWEEN WEST GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER WILLY BRANDT AND FRENCH FOREIGN MINISTER MICHEL DEBRE TOMORROW WILL CENTER ON DEVELOPMENTS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA AND QUESTIONS RELATING TO THE COMMON MARKET, A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID HERE TODAY.

BRANDT WILL FLY TO PARIS TOMORROW MORNING AND, AFTER A LUNCHEON AND DISCUSSION WITH HIS FRENCH COUNTERPART, WILL RETURN TO BONN LATER IN THE DAY.

IT WILL BE THE FIRST BILATERAL MEETING OF THE TWO FOREIGN MINISTERS. IT IS BEING HELD UNDER THE TERMS OF THE FRANCO-GERMAN FRIENDSHIP PACT, WHICH CALLS FOR A MEETING OF THE TWO FOREIGN MINISTERS FOUR TIMES A YEAR.

THE LAST MEETING BETWEEN BRANDT AND A FRENCH FOREIGN MINISTER TOOK PLACE IN BONN LAST MAY, WHEN COUVE DE MURVILLE WAS STILL FRANCES MINISTER FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS.

ALSO TO BE DISCUSSED DURING BRANDTS VISIT TO PARIS TOMORROW ARE PREPARATIONS FOR THE VISIT TO BONN THIS MONTH BY PRESIDENT DE GAULLE.

DE GAULLE ARRIVES SEPT. 27 AND RETURNS TO PARIS THE FOLLOWING DAY. THE VISIT BY THE FRENCH LEADER IS ALSO CALLED FOR UNDER THE TERMS OF THE FRIENDSHIP TREATY.

THE BONN SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY THAT BRANDT WILL PURSUE THE QUESTION OF BRITAINS ENTRY INTO THE COMMON MARKET DURING HIS VISIT TO PARIS TOMORROW.
