C/S -- MORNING INTRO - HAJEK RETURNS

PRAGUE, SEPT. 7, REUTER -- CZECHOSLOVAK FOREIGN MINISTER JIRI HAJEK, TARGET OF BITTER CRITICISM FROM MOSCOW, IS BACK IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA TODAY.

MR. HAJEK AND HIS WIFE CROSSED THE AUSTRIAN BORDER NEAR BRATISLAVA YESTERDAY AFTERNOON .

HE WAS ON HOLIDAY IN YUGOSLAVIA WHEN THE WARSAW PACT FORCES MOVED INTO CZECHOSLOVAKIA ON AUGUST 20.

PRAGUE TELEVISION REPORTED LAST NIGHT THAT THE SOVIET DEPUTY FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. VASILY KUZNETSOV, HELD TALKS HERE YESTERDAY WITH PRESIDENT LUDVIK SVOBODA ON RELATIONS BETWEEN THEIR TWO COUNTRIES.

CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO SAID LAST NIGHT THAT THE NEW CZECHOSLOVAK PARTY PRESIDUM YESTERDAY DISCUSSED A REPORT SAYING THAT CONDITIONS ALREADY APPLIED FOR NEW NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN REPRESENTATIVES OF BOTH PARTIES TO THE MOSCOW AGREEMENTS.

THE PRESIDUM, WITH PARTY LEADER ALEXANDER DUBCEK IN THE CHAIR, WAS HOLDING ITS FIRST MEETING SINCE ITS ELECTION ON AUGUST 31.
