X/4 C/S -- RADIO PRAGUE REPORTS JOHNSON NEWS CONFERENCE

MUNICH, SEPT 7 (CMD) -- RADIO PRAGUE ONE THIS MORNING REPORTED ON PRESIDENT JOHNSON'S NEWS CONFERENCE LAST NIGHT.

THE RADIO SAID JOHNSON SAID THE U.S. WAS "SERIOUSLY CONCERNED" WITH THE SITUATION IN EAST EUROPE.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE BROADCAST:

"PRESIDENT JOHNSON STATED IN WASHINGTON YESTERDAY THAT THE U.S. GOVERNMENT WAS SERIOUSLY CONCERNED WITH THE SITUATION IN EASTERN EUROPE AND THAT IT WAS ATTENTIVELY FOLLOWING DEVELOPMENT THERE.

"AT HIS UNANNOUNCED PRESS CONFERENCE THE PRESIDENT ALSO MENTIONED THAT EVENTS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA DID NOT CONTRIBUTE TO A STARTING TALKS ON RESTRICTING NUCLEAR ARMAMENTS.

"AS REGARDS THE QUESTION OF THE AGREEMENT ON THE NONPROLIFERATION OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS, JOHNSON SAID THAT REGARDLESS OF DEVELOPMENTS IN EASTERN EUROPE THE UNITED STATES CONSIDERS THE CONCLUSION OF THE AGREEMENTS AS FAVORABLE TO U.S. INTERESTS."
