

X/4 C/S -- VLTAVA CALLS FOR PRACTICAL STEPS

MUNICH, SEPT 7 (CMD) -- THE SOVIET-SUPPORTED CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO STATION, VLTAVA, TODAY DEMANDED THE REALIZATION OF "PRACTICAL STEPS WHICH WERE THE SUBJECT OF THE MOSCOW TALKS."

THE RADIO ADDED THAT THE MOSCOW COMMUNIQUE ALSO PROVIDED THAT THE ALLIED TROOPS "DO NOT INTERFERE IN THE DOMESTIC MATTERS OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA; AND THE ALLIED TROOPS STRICTLY OBSERVE THIS DIRECTIVE."

THE RADIO WARNED AGAINST WHAT IT TERMED THE FALSIFIED TEXT OF THE MOSCOW DOCUMENT BEING SPREAD BY LEAFLETS IN PRAGUE AND IN OTHER PLACES. THESE "FALSIFICATIONS" ARE AIMED AT CAUSING CHAOS, THE RADIO SAID.

IT APPEALED TO COMMUNIST PARTY MEMBERS TO INFORM PARTY BODIES ABOUT THE "REAL CONTENTS OF THE MOSCOW COMMUNIQUE."

THE BROADCAST ALSO ATTACKED THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK WRITERS UNION, EDUARD GOLDSTUECKER; THE VICE-CHAIRMAN OF THE UNION, JAN PROCHAZKA, AND WRITER IVAN SVITAK, COMPARING THEM TO THE WOLVES IN A BOOK BY THE FAMOUS CZECHOSLOVAK WRITER, KAREL CAPEK.

HE WHO TEMPORARILY STOPPED THE POLITICAL STRUGGLE CONCLUDED PEACE WITH THE WOLVES, THE RADIO SAID.

RADIO VLTAVA ALSO CRITICIZED CZECHOSLOVAK TELEVISION. THE MOSCOW COMMUNIQUE SPEAKS ABOUT ALLIED TROOPS, THE RADIO SAID, BUT CZECHOSLOVAK TELEVISION "ALWAYS REFERS TO THESE TROOPS AS FOREIGN ARMIES." THIS PRACTICE INCITES "CERTAIN GROUPS TOWARD UNDERGROUND, SUBVERSIVE, ACTIVITY," THE BROADCAST SAID.
