

X-13/ EURO --- DEBRE, BRANDT : NO RETURN TO COLD WAR

PARIS SEPT. 7 (RFE SPECIAL/OVADIA) --- THE FRENCH AND WEST GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTERS AGREED IN PARIS SATURDAY THAT EUROPE SHOULD NOT AGAIN BE SUBJECTED TO A COLD WAR WAVE, DESPITE THE INTERVENTION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, AUTHORISED SOURCES SAID TODAY.

MICHEL DEBRE AND WILLY BRANDT TODAY CONFERRED WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE FRANCO-GERMAN FRIENDSHIP AND COOPERATION TREATY.

THE EUROPEAN SITUATION AFTER THE CZECHOSLOVAK OCCUPATION BY WARSAW PACT FORCES STOOD IN THE CENTRE FOR THIS MORNINGS CONVERSATIONS AT THE QUAI DORSAY, ACCORDING TO AUTHORIZED FRENCH SOURCES

THE TWO FOREIGN MINISTERS AGREED ON THE NEED TO AVOID A RETURN TO COLD WAR POLICY. HOWEVER, THEY ALSO AGREED THAT THE POLICY OF DETENTE ON THE CONTINENT COULD BE PURSUED ONLY IN A CERTAIN CLIMATE, DISTURBED BY THE MILITARY INTERVENTION OF THE WARSAW BLOC FIVE IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, THE SOURCES SAID.

IT WAS RECALLED THAT FRENCH FOREIGN MINISTER DEBRE HAD MADE A SIMILAR REMARK TO THE SOVIET AMBASSADOR VALLERIAN ZORIN A FEW DAYS AGO.

THE DISCUSSIONS BETWEEN THE TWO FOREIGN MINISTERS END THIS AFTERNOON.

PRESIDENT DE GAULLE AND CHANCELLOR KIESINGER ARE DUE TO HOLD THEIR BI-ANNUAL MEETING IN A FEW WEEKS IN BONN.
