"BUT WE, HERE, STRESS THAT THE SIX MUST DEFINE THEIR POSITIONS BEFORE OPENING NEGOTIATIONS," M. DEBRE SAID.

HE AND HERR BRANDT HAD SPOKEN VERY FRANKLY ABOUT COMMON INTERESTS AND CONCEPTS, HE ADDED.

HERR BRANDT, WHO ARRIVED THIS MORNING, SAID AFTER THE TALKS THAT FRANCE AND GERMANY HAD AGREED TO LOOK FOR A GENERAL BUILDING UP OF THE COMMON MARKET INCLUDING INCREASED TRADE BETWEEN THE SIX MEMBERS AND WITH BRITAIN.

"WE ARE SEEKING FURTHER CO-OPERATION TO STRENGTHEN TIES BETWEEN FRANCE AND GERMANY, AND THIS WILL BE FURTHER DISCUSSED WHEN GENERAL DE GAULLE VISITS BONN AT THE END OF THE MONTH," HE ADDED.

THE WEST GERMAN MINISTER, WHO RETURNS TO BONN TONIGHT, SAID THE FRENCH AND GERMAN GOVERNMENTS HELD SIMILAR VIEWS ON CZECHOSLOVAKIA. "CZECHOSLOVAKIA MUST AND SHOULD BE FREE OF FOREIGN TROOPS," HE SAID.
