CS - 1ST ADD 1800 INTRO - CZECHOSLOVAKIA (CN-111) XXX TOMORROW

CZECHOSLOVAK TELEVISION WAS CRITICISED BY THE SOVIET-SUPPORTED RADIO STATION VLTAVA TODAY FOR REFERRING TO "ALLIED TROOPS" AS "FOREIGN ARMIES". VLTAVA SAID THIS INCITED UNDERGROUND SUBVERSIVE ACTIVITY.

VLTAVA ALSO DEMANDED THE REALIZATION OF "PRACTICAL STEPS WHICH WERE THE SUBJECT OF THE MOSCOW TALKS."

CZECHOSLOVAK PRESIDENT SVOBODA CALLED FOR EFFORTS TOWARDS THE REALISATION OF AIMS OUTLINED BY THE JANUARY, APRIL AND MAY COMMUNIST PARTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE PLENARY SESSIONS.

SVOBODA ALSO APPEALED, IN A MINERS DAY MESSAGE, FOR HONOR, HUMAN UNDERSTANDING AND A REJECTION OF INJUSTICE.

ANOTHER APPEAL TO THE PEOPLE CAME TODAY FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK NATIONAL FRONT'S CENTRAL COMMITTEE, EVZEN ERBAN, WHO ASKED CZECHOSLOVAKS TO MAKE THE NATIONAL FRONT AN ORGANISATION WITH A HIGH LEVEL OF INTERNAL DEMOCRACY BUT TO REJECT THE CREATION OF POLITICAL FORCES OUTSIDE ITS FRAMEWORK.

IN BRATISLAVA, ON ALL-SLOVAK CONFERENCE OF COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN IS BEING HELD TODAY.

RADIO BRATISLAVA SAID THAT IN HIS INTRODUCTORY SPEECH, SLOVAK PARTY LEADER GUSTAV HUSAK SPOKE ABOUT THE POLITICAL SITUATION AND THE TASKS IT PRESENTED FOR THE STATE ADMINISTRATION AND PEOPLE'S COUNCILS.

BROADCASTS FROM BRATISLAVA AND PRAGUE SAID THE COUNTRY'S RAIL-WAY GOODS TRAFFIC WAS NEARLY BACK TO NORMAL, AND THAT CZECHOSLOVAK AIRLINES WOULD RESUME FLIGHTS TO MOSCOW, WARSAW, BERLIN, BUDAPEST AND SOFIA ON SEPTEMBER 9.
