IN EAST GERMANY, THE PARTY NEWSPAPER NEUES DEUTSCHLAND ATTACKED THE "NEW SOCIALISM" ADVOCATED BY "COUNTER-REVOLUTIONARIES IN THE CSSR AND THEIR WEST GERMAN ANTI-COMMUNIST PATRONS."

THE IDEA THAT PROBLEMS OF THE SOCIETY COULD BE SOLVED BY MEANS OF FREEDOM OF THE PRESS AND DEMOCRATIC PLURALISM WAS "ONLY A VARIATION OF THE FORMULA OF THE BALANCE OF FORCES" AND IT WAS SHEER HYPOCRISY TO PRETEND THAT ANY FORM OF HUMAN COMMUNITY COULD EXIST WITHOUT THE "USE OF ORGANS OF POWER," NEUES DEUTSCHLAND ARGUED.

THE EAST GERMAN DAILY JUNGE WELT TODAY SHARPLY CRITICIZED CZECHOSLOVAK LEADERS AS "IRRESOLUTE" AND DEMANDED THAT THEY TAKE RIGOROUS ACTION AGAINST THE "ORGANIZED COUNTER-REVOLUTION."

JUNGE WELT SAID IT WAS STILL POSSIBLE TO BUY NEWSPAPERS IN PRAGUE THAT CRITICIZED THE MOSCOW GOVERNMENTS.

THE POLISH NEWS AGENCY PAP ACCUSED "REACTIONARY FORCES" IN PRAGUE OF USING "POLITICAL LIES, RUMORS AND SLANDER" TO HALT THE "NORMALIZATION PROCESS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA."

IN BELGRADE, THE PRESIDENT OF THE YUGOSLAV YOUTH ORGANIZATION, JANEZ KOCIJANCIC, SAID TODAY THE OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA HAD SHOWN THAT "BUREAUCRATIC SOCIALISM" OFFERED NEITHER "HUMANE NOR JUST SOLUTIONS" TO SOCIAL PROBLEMS AND WAS NOT IN THE INTEREST OF THE WORKING CLASS.
