

C/S - CLASH AT LIMA CONGRESS

LIMA SEPT 7 (UPI)--WARSAW PACT COUNTRIES TODAY DEFENDED THEIR INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA AT THE 16TH WORLD INTERPARLIAMENTARY CONGRESS.

IN HEATED DEBATE ON A RESOLUTION CONDEMNING THE INVASION, DELEGATES FROM RUSSIA, POLAND, BULGARIA AND HUNGARY REPLIED TO ACCUSATIONS OF AGGRESSION FROM MANY OTHER CONGRESS MEMBERS.

THE RESOLUTION ASKED FOR AN "IMMEDIATE AND PERMANENT END TO ARMED INTERVENTION OR OTHER INDIRECT FORMS OF INTERVENTION, AS THE FOMENTING OF SUBVERSION AND TERRORISM, WHICH HAS AS THE OBJECT VIOLENT CHANGE OF AN EXISTING GOVERNMENT SYSTEM, WITH ONE STATE INTERVENING IN A CIVIL WAR OF ANOTHER."

UNITED STATES DELEGATE EDWARD J. DERWINSKI, HAD FRIDAY ACCUSED THE MOSCOW REPRESENTATIVES OF "ESTABLISHING A DANGEROUS PHILOSOPHY" BY DEFENDING THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA. SOVIET DELEGATE V.L. KOUDRIAVETSEV SAID TODAY THERE WAS "HYPOCRISY AND DECEIT OF CAPITALIST COUNTRIES" EVIDENT IN THE CONGRESS.

KOUDRIAVETSEV ALSO ATTACKED BY NAME THE CANADIAN DELEGATE, GRANT DEACHMAN, WHO SAID THE SOVIET UNION KEPT ITS PEOPLE IN SLAVERY.

"I CAN TELL YOU ONE THING," HE SAID. "A DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CANADA AND THE SOVIET UNION IS THAT IN THE SOVIET UNION THERE IS NO DOMINATION BY FOREIGN CAPITAL."
