X/4/9 C/S - WARSAW: KUZNETSOV VISIT LINKED WITH FORTHCOMING TALKS

MUNICH, SEPT. 8 (CMD) -- RADIO WARSAW SAID LAST NIGHT THAT THE VISIT TO PRAGUE BY SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER VASIL KUZNETSOV WAS LINKED IN PRAGUE WITH THE STATEMENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY PRESIDUM COMMUNIQUE THAT CONDITIONS HAD BEEN CREATED FOR CONCRETE CZECHOSLOVAK-SOVIET TALKS.

THE RADIO SAID THAT THE COMMUNIQUE OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY PRESIDUM GAVE PARTICULAR EMPHASIS TO THE NECESSITY OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF MOSCOW AGREEMENTS WHICH MEANT THE NORMALIZATION OF RELATIONS IN THE COUNTRY.

IT ALSO NOTED THAT "CONDITIONS HAVE BEEN ALREADY CREATED FOR CONCRETE AND RESPONSIBLE TALKS WITH THE AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES OF BOTH SIDES TO THE MOSCOW AGREEMENT," THE RADIO SAID.

"THIS STATEMENT IS LINKED IN PRAGUE WITH THE TALKS CONDUCTED BY DEPUTY MINISTER KUZNETSOV WHO AFTER YESTERDAY'S MEETING WITH PRESIDENT LUDVIK SVOBODA CONFERRED TODAY WITH THE FIRST SECRETARY OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE, ALEXANDER DUBCEK, AND PREMIER OLDŘICH CERNIK," THE RADIO SAID.

THE RADIO ADDED THAT POLISH PRESS AGENCY CORRESPONDENTS REPORTED THAT THE LAST SPEECH OF THE FIRST SECRETARY OF THE SLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE, GUSTAV HUSAK, WAS FAVOURABLY RECEIVED BY THE CZECHOSLOVAK PUBLIC OPINION.
