CS -- MORNING INTRO -- COMMUNIST POLEMICS

MUNICH, SEPT 8 (CNR) -- THE COMMUNIST MEDIA POLEMICS OVER THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA HAS CONTINUED.

A LENGTHY ARTICLE IN KOMMUNIST, THE SOVIET CENTRAL COMMITTEE'S PERIODICAL, SAID SATURDAY THAT THE DANGER OF THE ACTIVIZATION OF COUNTER-REVOLUTIONARY FORCES IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA HAD NOT RPT NOT BEEN ELIMINATED.

THE MAIN TASK, KOMMUNIST SAID, WAS TO LIQUIDATE FOREVER THE DANGER TO SOCIALIST ACHIEVEMENTS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

A PRAVDA ARTICLE CHARGED THE AUSTRIAN WEST GERMAN AND YUGOSLAV PRESS WITH SPREADING WILL STORIES ABOUT SOVIET TROOPS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA TO CONFUSE CZECHOSLOVAKS WHO WERE ABROAD.

THE NEWSPAPER SOVIETSKAYA ROSSIGA AND RADIO MOSCOW ACCUSED WESTERN INTELLIGENCE SERVICES OF BEING INVOLVED IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

IN EAST GERMANY, NEUES DEUTSCHLAND ATTACKED THE NEW SOCIALISM ADVOCATED BY SO-CALLED COUNTER REVOLUTIONARIES IN THE CSSR, AND THE DAILY JUNGE WELT ATTACKED CZECHOSLOVAK LEADERS AS IRRESOLUTE.

THE POLISH NEWS AGENCY PAP ACCUSED REACTIONARY FORCES IN PRAGUE OF USING POLITICAL LIES, RUMORS AND SLANDER TO HALT THE NORMALIZATION PROCESS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

IN BELGRADE, THE PRESIDENT OF THE YUGOSLAV YOUTH ORGANIZATION, JANEZ KOCIJANCIC, CRITICIZED THE OCCUPATION OF ONE SOCIALIST COUNTRY BY ANOTHER. THE AUSTRIAN PARTY PAPER VOLKSSTIMME CALLED FOR WITHDRAWAL OF WARSAW PACT TROOPS AND, IN ROME, A LEADING COMMUNIST, GIORGIO AMENDOLA, DEFENDED THE ITALIAN PARTY'S CONDEMNATION OF THE INVASION.
