

CS - MORNING INTRO -- DEBRE AND BRANDT

MUNICH, SEPT. 8 (CNR) FOREIGN MINISTER WILLY BRANDT IS BACK IN WEST GERMANY TODAY FOLLOWING A MEETING IN PARIS WITH FRENCH FOREIGN MINISTER MICHEL DEBRE, WHO CHALLENGED THE SOVIET UNION TO SHOW THAT IT HAD NOT RPT NOT REJECTED AN EAST-WEST DETENTE.

DEBRE SAID AFTER THE TALKS WITH BRANDT SATURDAY THAT THE CHANCES OF A RETURN TO NORMAL IN EUROPE WERE DIRECTLY LINKED TO A DETENTE. IT WAS UP TO THE SOVIET UNION TO SHOW BY ITS DECISIONS THAT IT HAD NOT RPT NOT RENOUNCED SUCH A DETENTE, DEBRE ADDED.

THE WEST GERMAN MINISTER SAID THE FRENCH AND WEST GERMAN GOVERNMENTS THOUGHT ALIKE ON CZECHOSLOVAKIA. CZECHOSLOVAKIA MUST AND SHOULD BE FREE OF FOREIGN TROOPS, HE SAID.

BUT THE WARSAW PACT COUNTRIES PRESENTED A UNITED FRONT AGAINST OUTSIDE CRITICISM AT THE 16TH WORLD INTERPARLIAMENTARY CONGRESS IN THE SOUTH AMERICAN CITY OF LIMA.

A HEATED DEBATE ON A RESOLUTION CONDEMNING THE INVASION DREW DEFENSIVE SPEECHES FROM THE SOVIET, POLISH, BULGARIAN AND HUNGARIAN DELEGATES.

IN WEST EUROPEAN CAPITALS THERE WERE FURTHER PROTESTS AT THE CONTINUING OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

EUROPEAN FREE TRADE UNION LEADERS MEETING IN BRUSSELS ISSUED A SHARP ATTACK ON THE OCCUPATION.

IN LONDON, 18 LEADING BRITISH AUTHORS, SCIENTISTS AND UNIVERSITY PROFESSORS PUT THEIR NAMES TO A DEMAND FOR THE WITHDRAWAL OF SOVIET TROOPS FROM CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

A PARIS COMMITTEE OF SUPPORT FOR THE CZECHOSLOVAK PEOPLE SAID NEARLY ONE AND A HALF MILLION PEOPLE HAD SIGNED ITS CAMPAIGN AGAINST THE WARSAW PACT INTERVENTION.
