

MUNICH, SEPT. 8 (CNR) -- THE AFTERMATH OF THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA CONTINUES TO LEAD THE NEWS THIS MORNING.

ANOTHER CZECHOSLOVAK NEWSPAPER IS EXPECTED TO REAPPEAR TODAY FOLLOWING A DAY OF TALKS BETWEEN SOVIET FIRST DEPUTY FOREIGN MINISTER VASILY KUZNETSOV AND CZECHOSLOVAK LEADERS.

BRITISH FOREIGN SECRETARY GOES TO RUMANIA TODAY IN THE FIRST VISIT TO EASTERN EUROPE BY A WESTERN MINISTER SINCE THE INVASION. HE HAD ALSO BEEN SCHEDULED TO VISIT SOFIA AND BUDAPEST BUT THOSE VISITS WERE CANCELLED WHEN BULGARIAN AND HUNGARIAN TROOPS MARCHED INTO CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

WEST GERMAN CHANCELLOR KURT GEORG KIESINGER FLIES TO ISTANBUL TODAY AS HE CONTINUES HIS VISIT TO TURKEY.

ABOUT 5,000 FORMER CONCENTRATION CAMP INMATES AND ANTI-NAZI RESISTANCE FIGHTERS FROM EASTERN AND WESTERN EUROPE ARE EXPECTED TODAY AT THE UNVEILING OF A MEMORIAL TO THOSE WHO DIED AT THE DACHAU CONCENTRATION CAMP.

ON THE LIGHTER SIDE TODAY, THE VIENNA PHILHARMONY ORCHESTRA WILL GIVE A CONCERT IN THE KONZERTHAUS IN VIENNA. THE ORCHESTRA CONDUCTED BY KARL BOEHM WILL PERFORM BEETHOVEN'S SYMPHONY NR. 6 (PASTORAL) AND SCHUBERT'S SYMPHONY NR. 7 IN C-MAJOR.

AT THE CHATEAU OF CHANTILLY, THE CUSTOMARY "SOUND AND LIGHT" EVENING IS DEVOTED TO HUNTS. THE FAMOUS CASTLE, WHICH USED TO BELONG TO THE GREAT CONDE FAMILY, LIES ON THE EDGE OF A FOREST, WHERE KINGS AND KNIGHTS USED TO RIDE AFTER BOARS AND STAGS. TODAY, NO RPT NO HUNTING IS PERMITTED IN THE CHANTILLY FOREST AND THE ONLY WILD ANIMALS REMAINING ARE THE CENTURY-OLD CARP CRWDING THE MAOOATS.

IN CONNECTION WITH THE ROYAL AIR FORCE'S FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS, A DISPLAY OF HISTORIC AIRCRAFT WILL OPEN AT LONDON'S HORSE GUARDS PARADE, ORGANIZED BY THE RAF MUSEUM AND CONTINUE UNTIL SEPT. 15.

THE SKOL SIX-DAY CYCLE RACE STARTS AT WEMBLEY STADIUM. THE OFFICIAL OEPNING WILL BE MADE BY A ROUND-THW-WORD YACHTSMAN SIR ALEC ROSE WHO WILL RING THE BELL FOR THE START AT 1900. THE OPENING NIGHT IS A CHARITY PERFORMANCE IN AID OF THE "SAVE THE CHILDREN FUND."
