VISITS - PRAVDA PRINTS ATTACK ON BRITAIN

MOSCOW, SEPT 8 (UPI/CNR)- THE SOVIET NEWSPAPER PRAVDA SAID IN A COMMENTARY ON BRITISH FOREIGN MINISTER MICHAEL STEWART'S VISIT TO RUMANIA THAT BRITAIN'S GREAT POWER PRESTIGE DEPENDED ON WHAT IT DID TO DEVELOP GENERAL EUROPEAN COOPERATION.

IT SAID SOME BRITISH LEADERS WERE ATTEMPTING TO REVIVE THE COLD WAR.

THE COMMENTARY, WHICH APPEARED TODAY, WAS QUOTED FROM BY RADIO MOSCOW IN AN ENGLISH-LANGUAGE BROADCAST YESTERDAY.

SIGNED BY "JOURNALIST," DISCLOSED TO SOVIET READERS THAT BRITAIN HAD CANCELLED A WIDE RANGE OF CULTURAL EXCHANGES AND WAS CLOSE TO "BREAKING NORMAL RELATIONS WITH SOCIALIST COUNTRIES" IN DISPLEASURE AT MOSCOW'S CZECHOSLOVAK ACTION.
