X/4 CURT -- YUGOSLAV AMBASSADOR WALKS OUT OF SOFIA RALLY

MUNICH, SEPT 9 (CMD) -- RADIO ZAGREB REPORTED TODAY THAT THE YUGOSLAV AMBASSADOR IN SOFIA, KIRIL MILJOVSKI, WALKED OUT OF A SOFIA RALLY YESTERDAY IN PROTEST AGAINST REMARKS BEING MADE ABOUT YUGOSLAVIA'S OPPOSITION TO THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE RADIO SAID THE REMARKS WERE IN A SPEECH MADE BY IVAN PRAMOV, A SECRETARY OF THE BULGARIAN COMMUNIST PARTY'S CENTRAL COMMITTEE.

IN HIS SPEECH, PRAMOV -- AS QUOTED TODAY BY ZAGREB AND YESTERDAY BY RADIO SOFIA -- SAID THAT "PERPLEXITY AND DISSATISFACTION ARE CAUSED BY THE POSITION OF THE YUGOSLAV LEADERSHIP, WHICH DESCRIBED OUR FRATERNAL INTERNATIONAL AID TO THE CZECHOSLOVAK PEOPLE AS MILITARY INTERVENTION, AND DIRECTED ALL ITS PROPAGANDA AGAINST THE USSR AND OTHER SOCIALIST COUNTRIES."

PRAMOV ALSO SAID: "IT IS EVEN MORE INADMISSIBLE THAT, AFTER VAST FACTUAL MATERIAL EXPOSED THE PLOT OF THE COUNTER-REVOLUTION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, THE YUGOSLAV LEADERSHIP CONTINUES ITS UNFRIENDLY ATTITUDE TOWARD OUR COUNTRIES."
