X/4 C/S - RADIO LAUDED, TOLD ABOUT FUTURE TASKS

MUNICH, SEPT 9 (CMD) - CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO EMPLOYEES IN PRAGUE WERE LAUDED TODAY FOR THEIR PAST WORK AND TOLD THAT THE MOSCOW AGREEMENTS BETWEEN CZECHOSLOVAK AND SOVIET LEADERS "MUST FORM THE BASIS OF ALL WORK" IN THE RADIO.

PRAGUE RADIO SAID TONIGHT THAT EMPLOYEES OF THE RADIO RETURNED TO THEIR JOBS IN THE MAIN RADIO BUILDING IN PRAGUE AFTER MORE THAN TWO WEEKS' ABSENCE.

A MEETING OF THE EMPLOYEES THIS MORNING WAS ATTENDED BY DIRECTOR GENERAL ZDENEK HEJZLAR, MINISTER OF CULTURE MIROSLAV GALUSKA, CENTRAL COMMITTEE SECRETARY ZDENEK MLYNAR AND THE HEAD OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE'S PRESS DEPARTMENT, DUSAN HAVLICEK.

PRAGUE RADIO SAID THE COMMUNIST OFFICIALS ASSESSED THE PERMANENT WORK OF THE RADIO IN THE PAST WEEKS WHICH MADE POSSIBLE CONTACT BY STATE AND PARTY BODIES WITH THE PUBLIC.

IN AN ENGLISH-LANGUAGE BROADCAST, PRAGUE RADIO SAID HEJZLAR CALLED ON THE EMPLOYEES TO GO ON IN PREPARING PROGRAMS WHICH WOULD SUPPORT THE POST-JANUARY LINE OF THE PARTY AND THE PARTY'S ACTION PROGRAM, GOVERNMENT DECISIONS AND "ALL MEASURES ADOPTED IN THE LAST DAYS AIMED AT IMPLEMENTING THE MOSCOW AGREEMENTS."
