

X/4 C/S - SLOVAK JOURNALISTS WISH NON-INTERFERENCE

MUNICH, SEPT 9 (CMD) - THE COMMITTEE OF THE SLOVAK JOURNALISTS UNION TODAY SAID IT EXPECTS THAT THE PART OF THE MOSCOW AGREEMENT CONCERNING NON-INTERFERENCE WITH THE INTERNAL AFFAIRS OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA "WILL BE FULLY RESPECTED."

RADIO BRATISLAVA SAID TONIGHT THE BRATISLAVA MEETING OF THE SLOVAK JOURNALISTS UNION'S COMMITTEE WAS ATTENDED BY EDITORS IN CHIEF OF THE PRESS, RADIO AND TELEVISION IN SLOVAKIA, BY THE LEADING SECRETARY OF THE CZECH JOURNALISTS' UNION DR. STANISLAV MALECEK, AS WELL AS BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE SLOVAK OFFICE FOR PRESS AND INFORMATION ONDREJ CEMAN.

THE RADIO SAID THE SLOVAK JOURNALISTS COMMITTEE EXPRESSED THEIR DETERMINATION "TO SUPPORT THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY, HEADED BY COMRADE ALEXANDER DUBCEK, AS WELL AS THE NEW REPRESENTATION OF THE SLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY, HEADED BY DR. GUSTAV HUSAK (SLOVAK PARTY LEADER AND DEPUTY PREMIER), DURING THE REALIZATION OF THE ACTION PROGRAM OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY."

THE RADIO ALSO SAID THAT THE SLOVAK JOURNALISTS "EXPECT THAT THE PART OF THE MOSCOW COMMUNIQUE ON THE NON-INTERFERENCE WITH THE INTERNAL AFFAIRS OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA WILL BE FULLY RESPECTED."

THE RADIO SAID THE COMMITTEE OF THE SLOVAK JOURNALISTS UNION "CHARGED ITS PRESIDUM TO SAFEGUARD PROTECTION OF THOSE MEMBERS OF THE SLOVAK JOURNALISTS UNION WHO WILL NEED IT, AND NOT RPT NOT TO SPONSOR THE USUAL CELEBRATIONS OF THE 'DAY OF THE PRESS,' IN VIEW OF THE EXTRAORDINARY SITUATION IN THE REPUBLIC."
