

CS -- MORNING INTRO - COMMUNIST CRITICISM

MUNICH, SEPT 10 (CNR)-COMMUNISTS HAVE CONTINUED TO CRITICIZE THE OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE BELGRADE WEEKLY, ECONOMSKA POLITIKA, SAID MONDAY THAT MILITARY POWER WAS INCAPABLE OF SOLVING THE FUNDAMENTAL PROBLEM. IT SAID THAT IF THE SOVIETS DECIDED PERMANENTLY TO OPPOSE CHANGES IN EAST EUROPE BY FORCE IT WOULD LEAD THEM INTO ALLIANCES WITH THE MOST CONSERVATIVE ELEMENTS.

THE WEEKLY ADDED THAT IT WAS NOT RPT NOT STRANGE THAT CZECHOSLOVAKIA WAS THE FRONT-RUNNER IN TRENDS TOWARDS CHANGE. BUREAUCRATIC SOCIALISM COULD NOT RPT NOT BE REPRODUCED IN A DEVELOPED INDUSTRIAL SOCIETY.

IN A SIMILAR ATTACK SUNDAY, PIETRO INGRAO, POLITICAL OFFICE MEMBER OF THE ITALIAN COMMUNIST PARTY, SAID THAT REPRESSIVE METHODS AND MILITARY INTERVENTION IN THE COMMUNIST WORLD WERE UNACCEPTABLE.

HE ADDED THAT THE ORIGIN OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK CRISIS LAY IN THE BUREAUCRATIC CENTRALISM THAT HAD CHARACTERISED THE ADMINISTRATION OF FORMER PARTY LEADER ANTONIN NOVOTNY. EVERY ATTEMPT AND PRESSURE TO RETURN TO THOSE METHODS COULD ONLY AGGRAVATE THE CRISIS, HE ADDED.

NORTH KOREAN PARTY LEADER KIM IL SONG, MARKING THE COUNTRY'S 20TH ANNIVERSARY AS A REPUBLIC, CONDEMNED WHAT HE TERMED OUTSIDE PRESSURE ON FRATERNAL COUNTRIES. HIS REMARKS WERE REPORTED BY BOTH RADIO BUCHAREST AND RADIO CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

ERNST FISCHER, A PROMINENT AUSTRIAN COMMUNIST PARTY IDEOLOGIST, HAS CALLED FOR A EUROPEAN COMMUNIST CONFERENCE TO CONDEMN THE INVASION AND FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A NEW CENTRE OF THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT.

MEANWHILE, RADIO ZAGREB REPORTED MONDAY THAT THE YUGOSLAV AMBASSADOR IN SOFIA, KIRIL MILHOVSKI WALKED OUT OF A RALLY SUNDAY IN PROTEST AGAINST CRITICISM OF YUGOSLAVIA'S OPPOSITION TO THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA. MBW/F 0330/68 +
