MUNICH, SEPT 10 -- (CMD) -- CETEKA REPORTED TONIGHT THAT
A CONFERENCE IN PRAGUE TODAY FOUND THAT CZECHOSLOVAK SECURITY
FORCES ARE "FULLY ABLE TO DEFEND THE INTERESTS
OF SOCIALISM AND THE RIGHTS OF CZECHOSLOVAK CITIZENS."

THE NEWS AGENCY SAID THAT THIS WAS STATED AT A
CONFERENCE OF HIGH-RANKING OFFICIALS OF THE SECURITY FORCES
OF THE INTERIOR MINISTRY AND OTHER BRANCHES OF THE MINISTRY.

INTERIOR MINISTER JAN PELNAR, FOUR DEPUTY INTERIOR
MINISTERS AND CENTRAL COMMITTEE SECRETARY AND PARTY PRESIDUM
MEMBER ZDENEK MLYNAR WERE AMONG THOSE ATTENDING THE
CONFERENCE.

PELNAR TOLD THE CONFERENCE ABOUT THE TASKS OF CZECHOSLOVAK
POLICE AND OTHER BRANCHES OF THE MINISTRY.

MYLNAR SPOKE ABOUT MAIN POLITICAL QUESTIONS AND TASKS
RESULTING FROM THE RECENT MOSCOW AGREEMENTS BETWEEN SOVIET
AND CZECHOSLOVAK LEADERS.

IN SEPARATE GROUPS THE CONFERENCE THEN DISCUSSED "CONCRETE"
PROBLEMS OF THE WORK OF THE POLICE, STATE SECURITY AND
PARTY WORK IN THE SECURITY FORCES.
