X/4 C/S -- C/S TEACHERS TO HAVE DISCRETION ON LANGUAGE COURSES

MUNICH, SEPT 2 (CMD) -- CZECHOSLOVAK MINISTER OF EDUCATION VLADIMIR KADLEC -- SPEAKING OVER RADIO CENTRAL BOHEMIA YESTERDAY, TO MARK THE BEGINNING OF THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR -- SAID TEACHERS IN ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS WOULD HAVE DISCRETION IN DECIDING THE ORDER OF IMPORTANCE OF FOREIGN LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION.

THE MINISTER ALSO SAID THAT ESSENTIALLY "WE SHALL CONSISTENTLY IMPLEMENT ALL NEW MEASURES THAT HAD BEEN CONSIDERED IN CONSULTATION WITH THE TEACHERS AND WITH MANY PARENTS, ALREADY IN THE COURSE OF THE REVITALIZATION PROCESS."

HE SAID EDUCATION MUST BE BASED ON "DEEP DEMOCRATIC AND HUMANISTIC PRINCIPLES."

KADLEC ASKED ALL YOUNG PEOPLE TO HELP IN THE ECONOMY, PARTICULARLY IN AGRICULTURE IN THE PRESENT EXCEPTIONAL DIFFICULTIES, BUT HE PROMISED THAT THESE "BRIGADE ACTIVITIES" WOULD BE SUBSTANTIALLY REDUCED IN THE COMING SCHOOL YEAR.
